

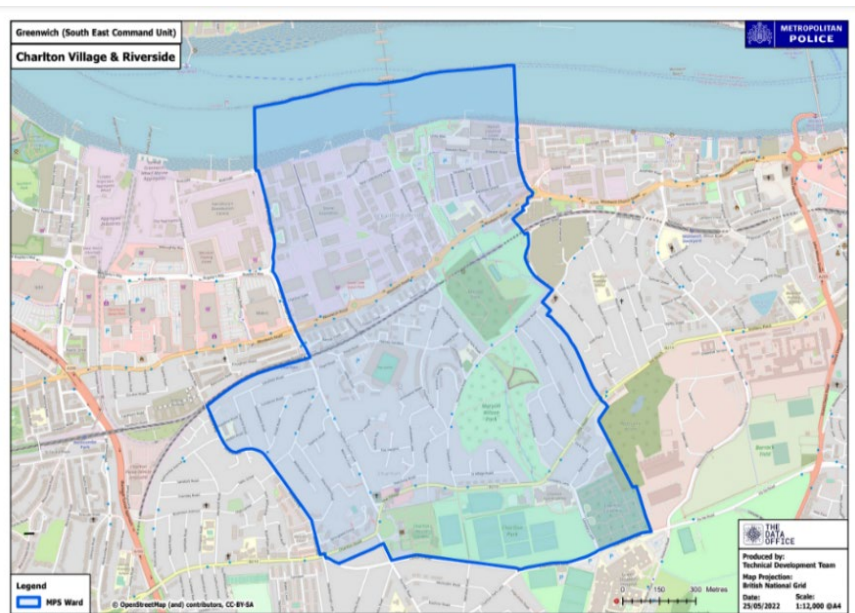
## **Charlton Village & Riverside Safer Neighbourhood Team Newsletter April 2025 Greenwich Police**

### **Charlton Village & Riverside Ward**

Your Safer Neighbourhood Team had a very busy month with lots of events across the ward.

Officers have continued to address ASB (Anti-Social Behaviour) issues in the following areas:

- Charlton Church Lane
- The Village
- Barney Close
- Charlton House
- Charlton Park
- Maryon Park
- Charlton Station
- Wellington Gardens
- The Thames Barrier
- St.Paul's Cl
- Victoria Way
- The Heights
- Herringham Road
- New Lynderburg Street.



We supported with reassurance visits for ASB, hate crime, theft of motor vehicles and shoplifting. In particular, officers provided local residents with additional-high visibility reassurance patrols in specific targeted areas, along with guidance on how to prevent burglaries and motor vehicles theft.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2025 a meeting was held with the Charlton Park Team to work in partnership to reduce ASB and crime. The aim was to improve intelligence gathering and to provide the best solution to make the park a safe space for the community.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2025, we attended the Charlton Village & Riverside Ward Panel Meeting at Valliant House, Valley Grove SE7, where the Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) presented crime statistics for the last quarter and outlined the main priorities and actions to improve community welfare. New priorities for the next three months include additional surveillance around Charlton House and Charlton Park in response to reports of drug dealing, increased foot patrols around Charlton Church Lane due to ASB issues and greater business engagement along the industrial area in Charlton Village & Riverside.

Special attention was given to collecting intelligence directly from the community. It is essential for our Team to focus on key issues across the ward. For this reason, in April a Community Ward Survey was made available to all residents to give the opportunity to share their views on safety.

The Met also conducted the OPERATION MOONTWIST, where SNT officers achieved significant results in the fight against Modern Slavery.

Thanks to collaboration with the Licencing Team, an illegal gambling room was shut down on Charlton Church Lane.

On Saturday 26th April and on Tuesday 29th April 2025, two police drop-in surgeries were held at The Valley and at Charlton House. These sessions gave local residents the opportunity to meet their local Safer Neighbourhood Team, raise concerns, and explain what actions they wanted local police units to take.

On the 28th April, another important meeting was held at Wellington Mansions, where the police discussed ASB incidents and different crime trends with staff and local residents.

We have supported other wards with traffic operations, crime scenes, arrest enquiries, warrant executions, protests and public events such as the London Marathon around Greenwich.

Officers are also working with external partner agencies to conduct Mental Health Assessments in the ward and assist residents experiencing breaches of the peace.

We urge everyone to remain vigilant and to contact their local teams for advice.
